Dnipro State University of Agriculture and Economics PROFESSIONALLY-ORIENTED FOREIGN LANGUAGE TEACHING IN A NON-LANGUAGE UNIVERSITY

In recent years, the modern educational system has undergone a number of reformed transformations, and the studying of a foreign language has become an important aspect for today. Language skills are important for future professionals and make them competitive in the global labor market. A special role is played by the study of foreign languages with a professionally - oriented direction. Such a study of foreign languages is aimed at reading texts on a specialty, studying terms and vocabulary, formation of professional competence, which will subsequently facilitate communication and implementation of tasks related to professional activities.

The basis of professionally-oriented training is the study of vocabulary and terms. Learning vocabulary is an important component in all types of speech activity. A large vocabulary of students indicates a high level of foreign language competence. This type of training should be in contact with a particular profession of future specialists and must contain topics related to the chosen specialty.

Due to the fact that students are not motivated professionally-oriented training faces the problem of memorizing specialized vocabulary.
